

### 3.1. Detailed System of Examination:

#### 3.1.1 Evaluation of Course Work

- The evaluation of a student's achievement in a course shall be based on performance in internal and external examinations. All examinations shall be monitored by the Dean of the College.
- It shall be the responsibility of the teacher(s) /Instructor(s) to ensure that the topics to be covered in the theory and practical in each course in a semester shall be recorded through a lecture/practical schedule and distributed to the students at the beginning of each course. The Head of the Department/Dean shall ensure that the schedule is adhered to and alternate arrangements are made to cover up the loss in case of any eventuality of unavoidable nature that has led to non-adherence of the above schedule.

#### 3.1.2. Type of Examination

The examination for each course shall comprise of theory/practical in Mid Term and End Term as the case may be. These examinations shall be conducted as per the following distribution of marks in lieu of the weightage of examination equal to 100 marks as expalined earlier and mentioned below:

- ✓ The Mid Term and End Term examinations shall be centrally conducted by the Dean during the period notified as per Academic Calendar under the due support and guidance from Controller of Examination.
- ✓ The schedule for examination shall be prepared by the concerned Dean and notified to the students and the teachers at least seven days before the commencement of the

examination. However, if the conditions so warrant, the Dean concerned may change the date of any examination on short notice.

- Duration of Mid Term and End Term examinations may vary between 1-2 hours and 2-3 hours, respectively.
- All the final practical examinations shall be completed before the commencement of End Term examination.
- For conducting End Term examination of theory, question papers for each course will be procured by the Dean concerned from external paper setters.
- The evaluation of final examination will be internal as described above.

### 3.1.3. Paper Pattern

The end term (theory) question paper covering the entire syllabus shall consist of following types of questions:

a. Objective (true/false/ fill in the blanks/ multiple choice, answerable in 1-2 words)	20%
b. Subjective questions & short notes	80%

In Mid Term examination also, the style of question paper should preferably be the same as above.

For practical examination, the pattern and marks distribution involve practical performance, practical records, projects and viva-voce.

**4. Grade awarding system:** Based on the evaluation conducted during the semester, the total marks are compiled to compute the final grades as given below:
